STEP 2: REQUEST OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS

Reference letters should be from two academic and/or professional persons. A reference may not be a relative of the applicant.

What are your professional career goals after completing your degree?

What are your strengths that will help you achieve your professional goals?

What do you consider to be areas for personal growth that may need the most attention during training as a therapist at Hope International University?
